UNSDCF Guiding Principles



UNSDC F rules of engagement



- 1. They must clearly articulate the United Nations' collective response to help countries address national priorities and gaps in achieving the SDGs.
- 2. It **must embody the spirit of partnerships** anchored in the 2030 Agenda. Including partnerships with host <u>governments</u>; with <u>civil society</u>, <u>academia</u>, <u>parliaments</u>, the <u>private sector</u>, <u>development partners</u>—to leverage everyone's strengths and drive transformative change
- 3. It must help turn the collective promise of the 2030 Agenda to leave no one behind into tangible action for people on the ground, especially the most vulnerable.

UNSDCF Outcomes



- OUTCOME1: <u>Basic Social Services</u> -Improved rights-based, gender-sensitive quality life with inclusive, equitable access and utilization of essential social services.
- OUTCOME 2: <u>Sustainable Economic Development</u> <u>Diversified and inclusive</u> economic growth; sustainable agriculture, food security, job creation; and resilience to climate change and natural disasters.
- OUTCOME 3: <u>Sustaining Peace and Security</u> Consolidated and sustainable peace;
 enhanced social cohesion, rule of law and human rights.
- OUTCOME 4: Governance and Transparency Good governance; transparent and strengthened institutions to the delivery of essential services targeting the most marginalized vulnerable



UNSDCF Implementation Updates

UNSDCF implementation was affected by COVID-19 outbreak in March 2020 following its endorsement in January 2020;

> First Joint Steering Committee Meeting held: First JSC meeting held August 4, 2021 between the Government and UN

The COVID-19 Socioeconomic Response Plan (SERP) was adopted to response to COVID and support recovery efforts

Results Groups are currently updating the JWP (2023-2024) to reflect emerging issues, projects and joint programmes

Joint Work Plan developed: Results Groups developed a multi-year joint work plan (2021-2022) in September 2021;
